

New Public Artwork by Rachel Champion at Nightingale's Corner, Berkeley Square, W1J 6EX

Grosvenor Britain & Ireland and Modus Operandi are pleased to announce a new public art commission in Berkeley Square.

Temporary Retention Site for Atmospheric Particles, by Rachael Champion, is situated on the North side of the Square in the recently pedestrianised area known as Nightingale's Corner - named after the famed romantic Vera Lynn song 'A Nightingale Sang in Berkeley Square'.

Please note that due to current Covid-19 restrictions and Government guidance, the launch of the art commission has been postponed until after lockdown. In the meantime the new artwork is visible online at www.modusoperandi-art.com and www.mayfairandbelgravia.com.

Temporary Retention Site for Atmospheric Particles takes its inspiration from the remarkable London Plane trees of Berkeley Square. Layered bark shaped panels with printed imagery surround a series of brightly coloured metal drums, each containing an array of bioremediating plant life known for their ability to reduce air pollution in urban environments. The metal drum containers refer to the petrochemical industry, a conceptual link to London's poor air quality. In this sculpture they are being repurposed as vessels to support biodiversity and a cleaner environment.

Champion's installation is the second temporary art commission created especially for this dedicated arts space and will be in place for the next 6 months.

Rachael Champion comments:

"Temporary Retention Site for Atmospheric Particles addresses the issue of air pollution within our cities. Located adjacent to Berkeley Square where some of the oldest and most majestic examples of the London Plane tree can be found, this artwork looks to other species for inspiration and collaboration to improve the quality of the air we breathe."

ARTIST

Rachael Champion

Rachael Champion (b. 1982, Long Island, New York, USA) graduated with a Postgraduate Diploma in Fine Art from the Royal Academy Schools in 2010. She lives and works in Thanet, UK.

Champion's artworks explore the physical, material, and historical relationships between ecology, industry, and the built environment. Her works are typically large in scale and consist of living organisms and ubiquitous building materials. Coalescing at an intersection between biology, geology, and architecture, Champion's work addresses the corporeality of the materials we extract, transform, and consume and how these actions affect the physical

characteristics of landscapes and ecosystems.

Champion's work has been exhibited in a number of recognised institutions including The Whitechapel Gallery (UK), Modern Art Oxford (UK), Camden Arts Centre (UK) and the Zabłudowicz Collection (UK). In October of 2019 she installed *Tower of Varieties*, an ambitious eleven metre suspended sculpture at the Hippodrome Theatre in Birmingham, UK. In 2017 she completed *Discoverers of Onkalo*, a permanent installation on the island of Sarvisalo, Finland commissioned by the Zabłudowicz Collection.

Rachael is represented by Hales Gallery London / New York.
